



Consistency of type triggers consistent sale result

COMMENTS have abounded about the consistency of the Kerlin Poll 2010 ram sale team, and that was demonstrated through a narrow price range at Saturday's SRS Classic Ram Sale.

There was a total clearance of Kerlin Poll's 10 rams, for a top of \$3400 and average of \$2360.

The SRS Classic multi-vendor sale included eight studs from across the NSW Central West, and buyers came from right across the State to the Wellington sale.

Kerlin Poll principal, Nigel Kerin, says he was rapt with how his 13-month-old rams stood up against other rams that were five and six months older.

"I am really grateful for the support of the buyers of our rams – all of whom commented on the size, robustness and wool quality of our young rams," Nigel says.

The top-priced Kerlin Poll ram was bought by a partnership of Adrian and Mel Scolari, Tomingley, and Rob Agnew, Peak Hill.

Other buyers of Kerlin Poll rams included; Richard and Dixie Stendell, "Ben Avon", Brewarrina; Brian Rathbone, "Gladstone", Wellington; and Nugget Carter, "Birimba", Nyngan.

One of our shearers and Parkes grazier, Andrew Henderson, even bought himself a Kerlin Poll ram. What better endorsement of our wool than to have one of our shearers buy Kerlin Poll!

The SRS Classic Ram Sale average jumped \$513 on last year's result, with 89 rams selling to a top of \$5800 – for a pure Severn Park-blood ram – and average of \$2072, for a 93% clearance.
